This year has been a remarkable one for our community. Through the efforts of our board, partners, and stakeholders, we've made significant strides in advancing economic prosperity, creating new opportunities for local businesses, and fostering an environment where innovation and growth can thrive. Together, we are building a brighter, more sustainable future for all.

I am pleased to report that in the last year, our team has been hard at work creating jobs, opportunities for investment, and connecting businesses to the resources they need to thrive. Through our business development efforts, Mission saw 800 new jobs created through the expansion and attraction of 40 companies and \$54M in capital investments. Additionally, MEDC injected more than \$600K into our local economy by assisting more than 30 small and micro businesses.

Our efforts to make Mission a great place to live, work, and play have been fruitful. Sales tax revenues grew by 9%, reaching an estimated \$27.5 million. Also, Mission became the new home to six national brands, including Murdoch's Ranch & Home Supply, Burlington, and Olive Garden.

As we look ahead, the Mission Economic Development Corporation remains committed to pushing the boundaries of what is possible for our community. The board, staff, and I will continue to collaborate, innovate, and invest in the future of Mission, ensuring that our city remains a vibrant hub for economic growth and opportunity. Thank you for your continued support and partnership, which makes all of this possible. Together, we will build on this momentum and achieve even greater success in the years to come.

PROGRESS BY THE NUMBERS

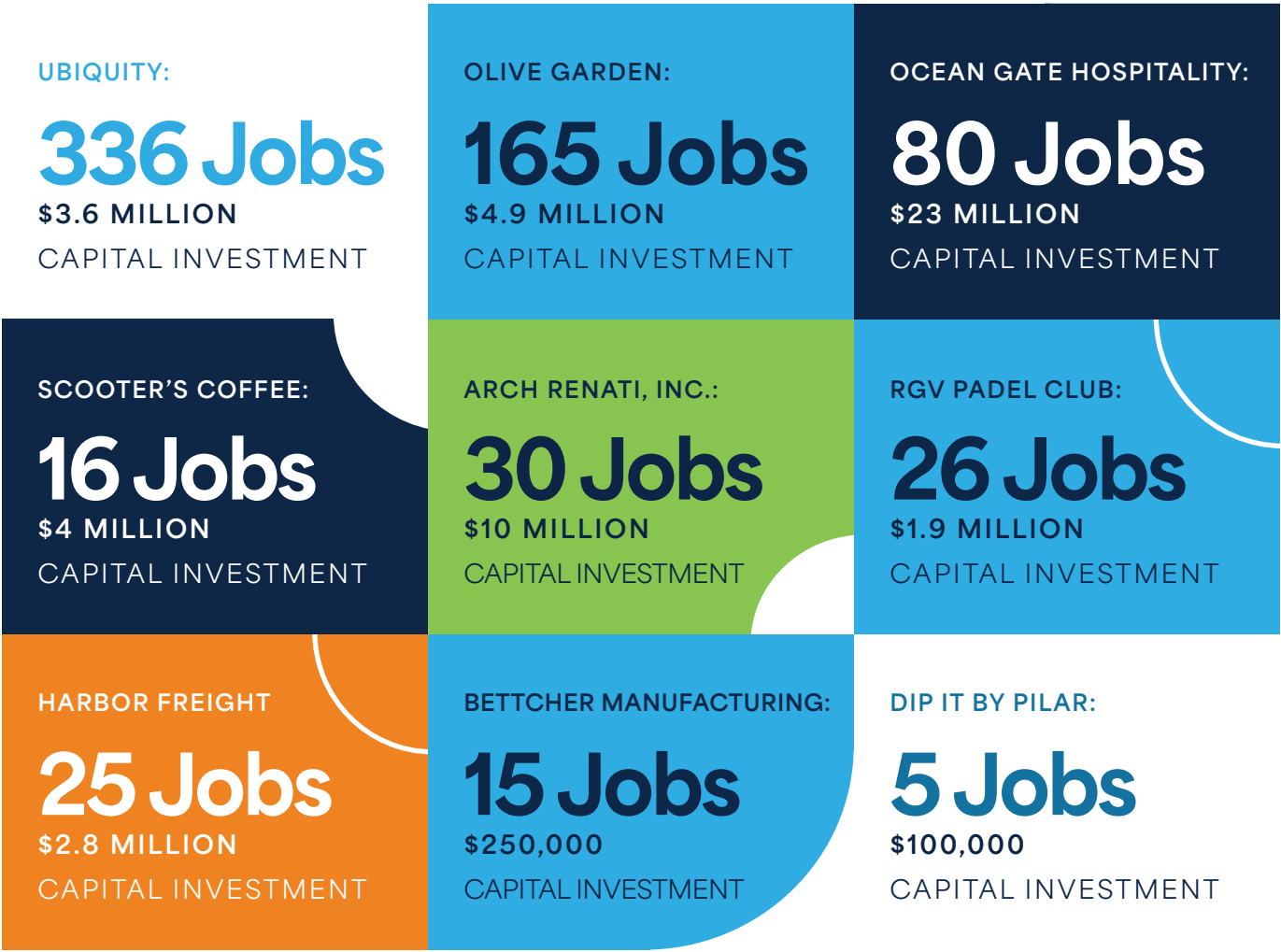
MEDC has had a successful year, driving significant economic growth and development. We supported over a dozen business relocations and expansions, resulting in tens of millions in capital investment.

BUSINESS RETENTION AND EXPANSION (BRE)

BRE is a key part of our strategy. About 80% of new jobs and capital investment come from companies that already exist in our community. Our BRE efforts focus on assisting businesses overcome challenges that could lead to closures or relocations, while also supporting their growth and expansion.

EXPANDING MISSION’S REACH BEYOND BORDERS

With its strategic location near the U.S.-Mexico border, Mission is uniquely positioned for international trade opportunities. The Anzalduas International Bridge expansion has paved the way for new trade routes and significant economic growth. Our team has been actively cultivating relationships with industry leaders and government officials in Mexico to capitalize on these opportunities.

We visited San Luis Potosí to attend Mexico Now’s Nearshoring Auto Industry Summit, where we signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the city of San Luis Potosí, Mexico.

About a month after, San Luis Potosí Governor Ricardo Gallardo Cardona visited us in Mission to learn more about the Anzalduas Bridge expansion and the economic opportunities in the Rio Grande Valley. As a result of these efforts, the governor established a trade office inside the CEED.

In 2024, we brought back the MEDC's staple program, and it came back in full force! This time around, the program was split into two. The competition portion remained, awarding 3 hopeful entrepreneurs with seed funding to launch their startup. Additionally, our "Build Mission Fund" spread the love to veteran entrepreneurs within Mission, granting 15 businesses with up to \$15K to help them take on projects and explore new economic opportunities.

Our pitch competition drew in support from across the Rio Grande Valley. Spectators were bussed in from all four counties as part of the first ever RGV Startup Week's festivities.

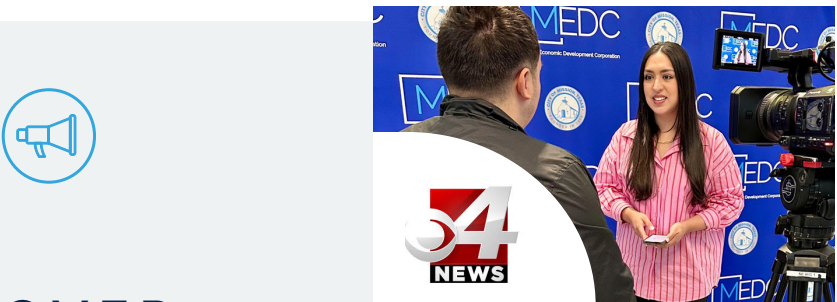

Supporting Our Community Beyond Business

Recruiting companies to Mission is only part of our commitment. We also focus on improving the quality of life for all residents. In 2024, MEDC gave over \$96,000 in donations to local non-profits and invested \$2 million in community improvement projects.

We also attract responsible corporate citizens. Through the MEDC, we encourage companies to give back. This year, our projects donated \$17K to local organizations supporting causes important to our community, and we recruited 5 new corporate-level members for the Greater Mission Chamber of Commerce.



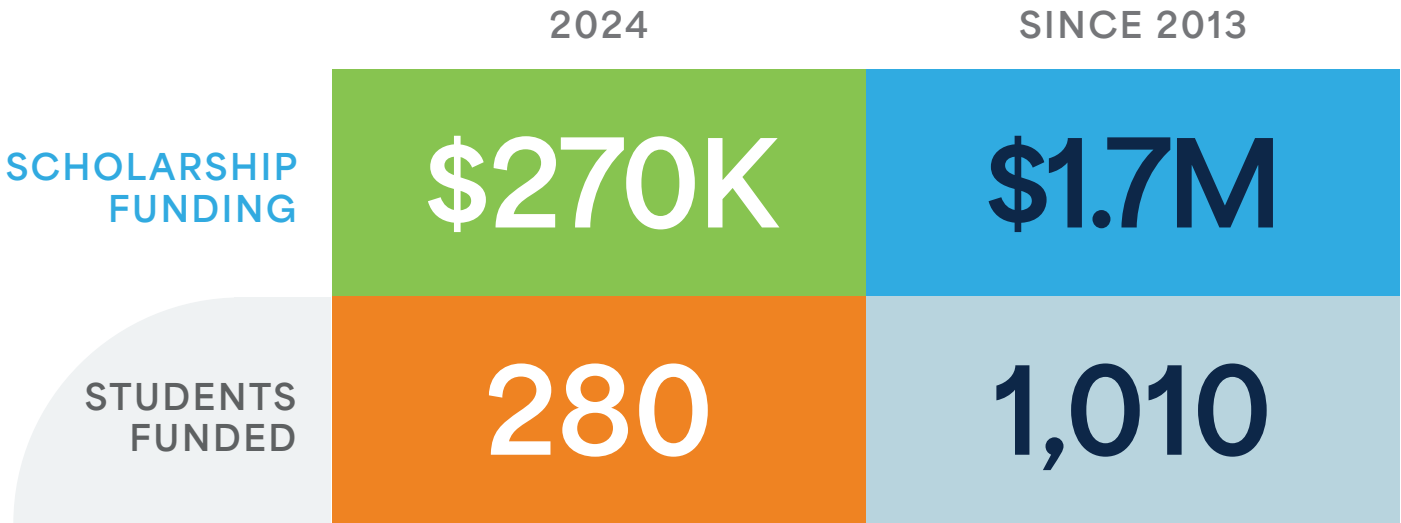

MEDA SCHOLARSHIP

These institutions will offer continuing education courses and offer support services to small businesses to create a robust ecosystem for both learning and entrepreneurship.

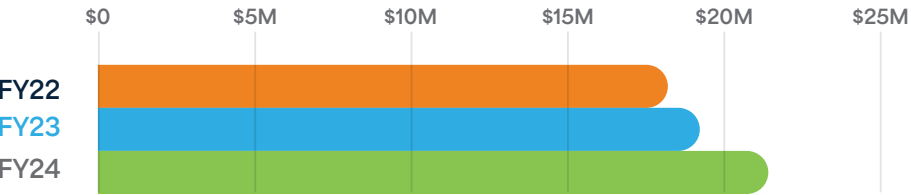
REVENUE, INCENTIVES, AND EXPENDITURES*

This year, MEDC exceeded its revenue projections by \$1 million, driven by a strong increase in sales tax and a boost in CEED revenue. We also invested strategically in incentives and small business programs, ensuring sustained growth and long-term impact.

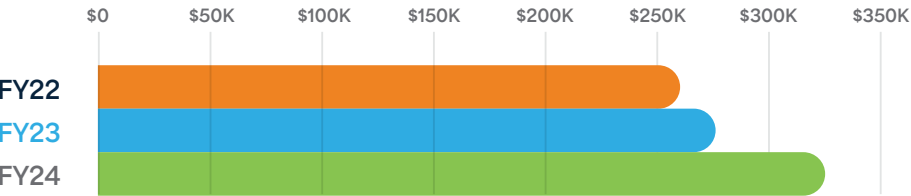
Sales Tax

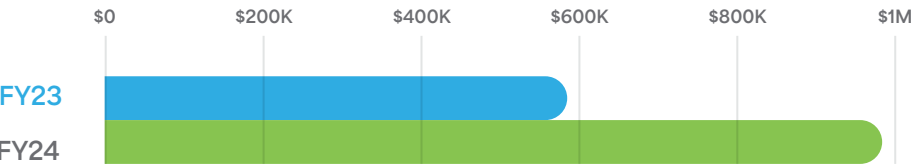
CEED Revenue

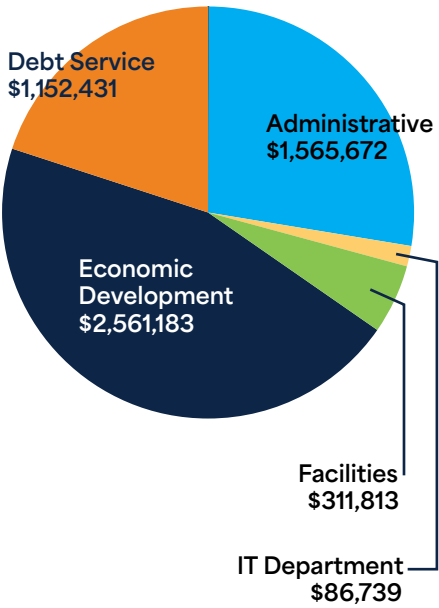


Incentives
